Brazil Boat Project

Your generous financial support has enabled the completion of the work needed to re-fit a catamaran boat, which will be used to provide medical care, share the Good News and provide discipleship opportunities for new believers.

Vast numbers of the Purus River People have never heard the Gospel and live in isolated communities that require a five to ten-day boat ride to reach a hospital in the nearest city. Thus there are hundreds of people dying due to lack of consistent medical care. The completed boat will aid as a mobile medical clinic, as well as a ministry tool with classrooms for training new believers and provide extra sleeping space for medical staff, missionaries and crew. This will allow for consistent medical care and spiritual support among those who need it most.

The few churches that operate in the Purus Region do not have discipleship programs or any training on how to disciple new believers. The newly completed boat will be a place for leadership training for pastors, as well as theological training for new believers.
